ELA stands for English Language Arts. Our ELA is integrated, which means we incorporate science and social studies into reading and writing lessons.

- Word Study

The only spelling I will grade for the report card are high frequency words (red words), words that have been taught and word patterns (word study). As the students learn the word patterns, their spelling should improve.

Word Patterns include: Digraphs, blends, vowel teams, magic e, and more!

*We want students to learn to problem solve, so please encourage using the sounding out strategy, or how to be independent, rather than spelling the word out for them.

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Everyday Mathematics



It is a research-based approach that is effective in developing children's understandings and skills that produce lifelong mathematical power.

How does this work with the EDM program?

This program uses spiral curriculum model - a **spiral curriculum** can be defined as a course of study in which students will see the same topics throughout their school career, with each encounter increasing in complexity and reinforcing previous learning

*Extra practice of the basic addition and subtraction facts at home is highly encouraged.

- Word Work students will have weekly words and should practice each night. A word work check will be given each week to assess students knowledge of patterns; not spelling.
- Home Links a Home Links booklet will be kept in your child's folder. We will not complete Home Links every night, so please watch for the highlighted lesson number on the top right side of the page. Kindly complete and send in the following day.
- Reading Log a reading log will also be kept in your child's folder. The goal is for students to read for 100 minutes per week (20 minutes daily). In the beginning of the year, your child can read or you can read to your child both count on the reading log. A mix of both is best, in order to promote a love for reading. After we're settled into the school year, please encourage your child to read to you for the full 20 minutes and record books on RAZ (I will award bonus stars).
